Welcome and Announcements

WE READY OURSELVES TO WORSHIP

Reflect quietly and prayerfully on these words as we prepare to enter into worship.

Since the title of today's message is "Dialogue and Debate" I thought it might be appropriate to reflect on how believers in Christ are called to do these things with one another. In doing this, I found this section entitled "On Edifying Theological Disagreement" from a recent document presented to our presbytery to be commendable.

"In 2 Tim. 2:23-35 Paul instructs Timothy, a church leader, first, to avoid 'foolish and ignorant disputes'—why?—because they only generate quarrels (v. 23). As for those disputes that are not 'foolish and ignorant' he must engage them not in a quarrelsome or argumentative manner (v. 24a), but in a manner that is (i) tender and gentle (vs. severe, abrupt or harsh); (ii) possessing the necessary knowledge of both the topic and the recipient and the skill to instruct (vs. being culturally and pastorally uninformed, out of touch, relying upon hearsay, etc.); and (iii) graciously patient, absent of annoyance, resentment or irritation (v. 24b). To his opponents, he must (i) offer positive guidance, like a good coach (vs. merely offering negative critique), doing so (ii) with humble gentleness (vs. condescension, superiority, bluntness, or insensitivity). It is this positive guidance, gently given, that can be the means by which two beautiful things can happen: (i) God could enable one's opponents to turn and walk anew in God's life-giving ways, resulting in a "knowledge of the truth" and (ii) these opponents would "sober up" and escape the snares of deception, by which the Father of lies has held them captive, to do his will (v. 26). Clearly, then, in theological disagreements 'spiritual warfare' is a significant dimension, and opponents, to the extent that they are in error, are to be regarded as prisoners, captive to the Enemy's will, and thus need to be corrected with great concern and compassion."

May we be the type of believers that are able to stand firm in the truth of scripture AND in the spirit of kindness and gentleness to which we are exhorted in the very same!





New Testament Reading—Hebrews 11:32-12:2

Recounting the faithfulness of God's people across the generations

And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets— who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received back their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, so that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were killed with the sword. They went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, mistreated—of whom the world was not worthy—wandering about in deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth.

And all these, though commended through their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had provided something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect. Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.






