Welcome and Announcements

WE READY OURSELVES TO WORSHIP

Reflect quietly and prayerfully on these words as we prepare to enter into worship.

One of my favorite parts of the *Lord of the Rings* trilogy is when the Elvish Queen Galadriel is seeing off the fellowship of the ring and giving to them unique gifts that she foresees will be of great value to them on their perilous journey. In that exchange, Galadriel says to Frodo,

"And for you, Frodo Baggins, I give you the light of Earendil our most beloved star. May it be a light to you in dark places when all other lights go out."

For Frodo, that light came in handy when he was plunged into darkness, when he had to fight, and when he was uncertain about which way to go. On each occasion, it shone brightest when his faith in its promise was most alive.

One must be careful in over-allegorizing the Lord of the Rings, and yet, at the same time there are things said in this majestic story that are deeply rooted in biblical ideas. This quote reminds us of one of them and it is this: There is a kind of light that transcends all others and that will shine on when all other kinds of light go out.

In our text for this morning, Jesus essentially says that he is the light that will never go out, even when all others vanish. In my life as a pastor I have sat with people time and time again, who when facing the loss of a great light in their life have found solace in the one light, Jesus Christ, that will never go out.

As we come to the scriptures this morning, ask yourself this question: Can I tell the difference between the lesser lights and the one true light that never goes out?



New Testament Reading—Philemon 4-22

Paul's Plea for Onesimus' Freedom

I thank my God always when I remember you in my prayers, because I hear of your love and of the faith that you have toward the Lord Jesus and for all the saints, and I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective for the full knowledge of every good thing that is in us for the sake of Christ. For I have derived much joy and comfort from your love, my brother, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you.

Accordingly, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do what is required, yet for love's sake I prefer to appeal to you—I, Paul, an old man and now a prisoner also for Christ Jesus—I appeal to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I became in my imprisonment. (Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful to you and to me.) I am sending him back to you, sending my very heart. I would have been glad to keep him with me, in order that he might serve me on your behalf during my imprisonment for the gospel, but I preferred to do nothing without your consent in order that your goodness might not be by compulsion but of your own accord. For this perhaps is why he was parted from you for a while, that you might have him back forever, no longer as a bondservant but more than a bondservant, as a beloved brother—especially to me, but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

So if you consider me your partner, receive him as you would receive me. If he has wronged you at all, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. I, Paul, write this with my own hand: I will repay it—to say nothing of your owing me even your own self. Yes, brother, I want some benefit from you in the Lord. Refresh my heart in Christ. Confident of your obedience, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say. At the same time, prepare a guest room for me, for I am hoping that through your prayers I will be graciously given to you.

Reader: The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of

the Lord stands forever!


