# WE READY OURSELVES TO WORSHIP

Reflect quietly and prayerfully on these words as we prepare to enter into worship.

What is it that makes betrayal so devastating?

At its core, it is this: That the one doing the betraying has placed a value on the relationship with you and determined that something or someone else is worth more.

In life, we experience many relatively small types of betrayal, like breaking up with someone in high school or being let go from a minimum wage job. In other circumstances the betrayals are more serious, like being fired by a boss that we thought we were friends with or being cheated by a good friend in a business deal. And finally, there are the life-altering sorts of betrayal that we may only experience once or twice in a lifetime, like our spouse having an affair or our children refusing to have any kind of relationship with us.

Each of these types of betrayal are increasingly more painful because the relational circle tightens and the kind of vulnerability we permitted was greater at each successive ring. As such, recovering from a betrayal is one of the most complex and difficult circumstances a person can experience.

In today's passage we encounter the foundations of two devastating betrayals in the life of Christ, the first from Judas and the second from Peter. Amazingly, in between the descriptions of these devastations, we find Jesus instructing his disciples in the art of love! How can that be and what can we learn from Jesus about what it means to be faithful along the way?



# \*Confession of Faith Using the Words of the Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God. Begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.
