WORSHIPING THE GOD WHO REDEEMS US

WE READY OURSELVES TO WORSHIP

Reflect quietly and prayerfully on these words as we prepare to enter into worship.

Wayne Grudem, in his Systematic Theology, asks a question that all of us have pondered at some time in our life: "Was there any other way for God to save (redeem) human beings than by sending his Son to die in our place?" His answer is helpful in that it points us to five critical scripture texts for help in forming a biblically informed answer.

First, he points to 2 Peter 2:4 to remind us that there is a sense in which God didn't have to save anybody because he didn't spare the fallen angels. *"For if God did not spare angels when they sinned, but cast them into hell and committed them to chains of gloomy darkness to be kept until the judgment."*

But once God determined that he desired to save fallen humanity there was only one way to do so. Matthew 26:39 indicates that it would require the substitutionary death of his son, Jesus. *"And going a little farther he (Jesus) fell on his face and prayed, saying, 'My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will.'"*

In Luke 24:25-26, after his resurrection, we see that Jesus understood that his death and resurrection was a part of God's necessary plan to save. "And he said to them, 'O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?""

Paul, in Romans 3:26, shows that when the Father and the Son covenanted together to accomplish redemption, they did so to uphold both God's perfect justice and his perfect love. *"It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus."*

And finally, in Hebrew 9:23-26 we see that God was always pointing forward to a time when the sacrificial system would come to a culmination in the once and forever sacrifice to end sin. *"Thus it was necessary for the copies of the heavenly things to be purified with these rites, but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these. For Christ has entered, not into holy places made with hands, which are copies of the true things, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself repeatedly, as the high priest enters the holy places every year with blood not his own, for then he would have had to suffer repeatedly since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself."*
