Our closing hymn today is well known to most, "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name." The text was composed by Edward Perronet but the tune came from Oliver Holden.

In their book of hymn stories, *Hosannas*, *Loud Hosannas*, Keith and Kristin Getty write this about the composition of this wonderful hymn:

"In 1793 Holden, a carpenter, realtor, music educator, legislator, and pastor in Charlestown, Massachusetts, composed this melody and called it CORONATION. A coronation is the occasion for placing a crown upon the head of a king or queen.

As you sing this hymn, picture in your mind's eye a coronation attended by every Christian believer who has ever lived. Add all the angels and heavenly beings to the picture. They all join in this great cry of acclamation to Jesus as each lays crowns before Him."

saints, for the people of Israel who are near to him.




