On Thursday, the deacons helped deliver all of the food and household items to Robinson Elementary for the Food Pantry. I'm not sure if you've seen the Narthex these past few weeks but the welcome desk area was packed! And we loved it. Thank you all for your generous hearts.

As shared last week, we asked the school social worker, Dima, if there were any families that she knew of that are struggling during this time to provide gifts for their children. She immediately thought of two families and reached out to them. Those families have provided lists of desired toys for Christmas, as well as sizes for clothing (such as coats and shoes).

HOW TO HELP: We have added tags for those items at the top of our Giving Tree. Please take what you can provide and return your present gift wrapped with the tag attached (so we know what? and who?). The presents can be placed under the tree in the Narthex until the 18th.

SOMETHING TO CONSIDER - If you picked a tag for a doll or action figure, please be sensitive to the ethnicity and/or color of toy. Take into consideration the following when making your purchases.

- If your tag says- "Female age 5 (favorite color: pink)" or "Female age 7 (favorite color: light blue)" this family is **white**.
- If your tag says- "Female age 7 (favorite color: pink)" OR "Male age 9 (favorite color: blue and black)" this family is **African American**.
