Devotional Preparation:

Our 2022 Advent Theme was, "The Weary World Rejoices," a line taken from the hymn, "O Holy Night." Over the course of Advent we preached on the weariness we experience in relation to oppression, sin, suffering and our efforts to be obedient. Little did we know what we were about to experience on Christmas Eve when the sprinkler pipes in our building froze and burst, dumping thousands of gallons of water into our building, causing a massive amount of damage that we are still now trying to fully account for.

This is one of those times when the topics we address in preaching comes alive in a very poignant way!

Certainly, what we've experienced here at Trinity is nothing like the oppression David faced from his enemies nor even the suffering Job faced when he lost his family, but as I said in one sermon, the point of these stories isn't to get us to try and rate our weariness against those who have gone before us as much as it is to call us to faith and joy when we face our own weariness.

And that's what we experienced when dozens of members and regular attenders showed up at the church on Christmas Eve, not dressed to worship, but to work!

What a joy it was to see God's people, mops in hand, still wishing one another a Merry Christmas!



WE HEAR FROM GOD'S WORD New Testament Reading—Matthew 2:13-23

The Flight to Egypt

Now when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." And he rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed to Egypt and remained there until the death of Herod. But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he withdrew to the district of Galilee. And he went and lived in a city called Nazareth, so that what was spoken by the prophets might be fulfilled, that he would be called a Nazarene.




