WE READY OURSELVES FOR WORSHIP

Deuteronomy 1:45 contains what seems to be one of the most terrifying verses in the bible. It recounts the moment after Israel had rebelled against the Lord, ignored his warnings and gone into battle without his aid, a mistake that caused them to be routed. On the heels of this disobedience Deuteronomy states:

And you returned and wept before the Lord, <u>but the Lord did not listen to your voice or give ear to you.</u>

Does this mean that there are moments when God refuses to hear our prayers?

The answer is yes, and no.

"Yes," in the sense that when our prayers are offered out of selfishness and an expectation that God needs to give us what we want when we want it, then He will not listen. Here in Deuteronomy 1:45 Israel's weeping is not repentance as much as it is embarrassment for being caught out.

Having said that, the answer is also "no," because even if God does not "listen" to our prayers, He still "hears" them. This is because 1) He's God and He knows and sees everything and 2) Because in order to discern whether our prayers are offered earnestly God must assess them.

So Israel's weeping was "heard" but it was not "heeded/listened to" because it was not earnest.

What this verse should inspire in us is taking a moment to assess whether we are offering our prayers and intercessions before God with the proper respect, earnestness and humility. If we are, then He both "hears" and "listens" and in doing so He determines what is best for us.



A Living Stone and a Holy People

Like newborn infants, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up into salvation— if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.

As you come to him, a living stone rejected by men but in the sight of God chosen and precious, you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in Scripture:

Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.
