The Psalms contain an astonishing mixture of human emotions ranging from grief to utter joy. Psalm 6 is on those Psalms that contain both ends of this spectrum beginning with the depths of despair and ascending into the heights of deliverance.

Sometimes our lives follow this arc as we move from moments in which God seems distant or angry or even absent into moments of extraordinary personal communion and intimacy with him. When this occurs, we can be exceedingly grateful.

But, sometimes, we find ourselves groping around for a long time in the depths and wonder when or if God will ever deliver us.

I spoke with a friend this week who is fighting through one of these seasons, wondering if God is listening and straining to understand why He would allow the suffering that this individual and their family are experiencing.

The psalmist knows experiences like this as well and wrote about one of these seasons in Psalm 88. Among its most poignant lines are these: O Lord, why do you cast my soul away? Why do you hide your face from me?

As a pastor, I wish I knew the answer to this question. But I do not. Only God does. The reality is that sometimes it feels as if we have been left alone by God, though we know we have not.

All I can say about moments like these is that God is doing something to draw us in. C.S. Lewis speculated on this as he walked through his own grief when he said:

"Pain insists upon being attended to. God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our consciences, but shouts in our pains. It is his megaphone to rouse a deaf world."

As we ponder Psalm 6 today, we do it in the context of Psalm 88 and we note that in both places the psalmist said...O Lord! May God be our Lord, whatever we face today.

#### Ben and Kim Church are here!!

Ben and Kim Church, serving in Kampala, Uganda with Mission to the World, will be in St. Louis for the summer. They safely arrived this week and are currently being hosted by Grace Church in their missionary house in St. Charles. They are here for two reasons:

First, Kim is looking to complete her Master of Nursing program to become a Nurse Practitioner. She began her final clinical assignment yesterday at Care STL clinic in St. Louis City. Kim is also preparing to take her board certification exam, possibly in August. They are very excited for how this additional equipping and qualification will enable her to develop a biblical healthcare ministry within their church and presbytery in Uganda.

Secondly, they are here to report to and connect with you who have been supporting them through your prayers and giving. They have so much that they are excited to share. So, we have invited Ben to preach on July 30<sup>th</sup> during our worship service. He will be joining us in our series in the Psalms. This is a great opportunity for us to hear from someone who primarily preaches and teaches in a completely different context. (As a side thought, I know that short-term missions trips partner with Ben in Uganda. What say you Trinity? Any interest?)

#### **Meghan Rintoul Update**

Meghan has been officially cleared to move to England this summer to serve with Campus Outreach. Meghan will serve in Birmingham, which is the 2nd largest city in England, and Europe's youngest, with over 100,000 college students across several universities. Further, Meghan's work will take the Gospel to the ends of the earth as the University of Birmingham has 35,000 students with 9,000 of those from 150 different countries.
