Devotional Preparation

Today we return to the book of Deuteronomy and in doing so we are going to be pulling together two different texts (Dt. 4:1-3 and Dt. 19:1-13) that speak about the cities of refuge commanded by God in scripture.

These cities were proscribed by God for people who found themselves in the middle of a storm of false accusations about the taking of life. These were the first "sanctuary cities."

Today's "sanctuary cities" have little in common with their biblical forerunners in that the text of scripture is clear that these cities were not for law-breakers, but for those who truly broke no law and were innocent of the charges levied against them. That said, our modern day "sanctuary cities" do stand as public reminders that we need a place to go when we are in trouble.

It's this core idea that helps us to understand why our place of worship is referred to in scripture as a "sanctuary." In the Hebrew the word is miqdash and means "a consecrated place." In the Greek the word is oikos which usually means a house or household. Together the idea is that our places of worship are like a family home consecrated to the service of God within which we can feel peace because, if we are his children, we are protected by our Heavenly Father.

As we come to worship this morning be refreshed in the knowledge that you are in God's sanctuary and as such you can have peace as you sit under the protection of your God.


