Devotional Preparation


Today's sermon text is of special importance to me because it was foundational in the development of my Doctoral Dissertation on Pastoral Succession Planning. For reasons that will become obvious, I focused intently on the process that the Lord led Moses and Joshua through to create the conditions that made both of them and the people of Israel ready for a change in leadership.

And this wasn't just any change in leadership, this was a change from perhaps the most significant human biblical figure (Moses) to his successor, Joshua. No transition is easy, but transitions involving a founder or long term leader are the most complex, as we will see in the next few sermons.

On a very personal note, I want to underline the fact that while the elders and I have already begun conversations related to pastoral succession, I am still many years away from the event itself (Lord willing!). That said, healthy transitions take a lot of prayer, time and developmental work, a process modeled very well in the transition that took place between Moses and Joshua.

And when Peter saw it he addressed the people: "Men of Israel, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we have made him walk?
