Devotional Preparation

An Excerpt from "On Marriage" by Tim and Kathy Keller

The theme of God as the bridegroom of his people runs all through the Bible. In the Old Testament, of course, God calls himself the husband of Israel. But Israel constantly turned to worship other gods and in so doing she is spoken of as being guilty of spiritual adultery. Jeremiah 2-3 and Ezekiel 16 are vivid depictions of this "bad marriage," but the most famous exposition of this theme is in the book of Hosea. There God tells his prophet to marry Gomer, a woman who will be unfaithful to Hosea, "for like an adulterous wife this land [Israel] is guilty of unfaithfulness to the LORD" (Hosea 1:2). And this is what happens. She goes after the other lovers.

The most famous and poignant part of the story comes in the third chapter. Gomer has not only been unfaithful, she seems to have fallen into prostitution, because the only way Hosea can get her back was to purchase her from a man who owned her. God tells Hosea to do just that. Hosea writes:

The LORD said to me, "Go, show love to your wife again, though she is loved by another man and is an adulteress. Love her as the LOD loves the Israelites, though they turn to other gods and love the sacred raisin cakes." So I bought her for fifteen shekels of silver and about a homer and a lethek of barley. Then I told her, "You are to live with me many days; you must not be a prostitute or be intimate with any man, and I will behave the same way toward you." (Hosea 3:1-3)

This is more than just a moving story of indefatigable love. God id hinting that, just as it requires costly self-sacrifice to love a way-ward spouse, so his love for us, if it is going to be maintained, will entail cost and sacrifice on his part as well. And in Jesus' life and death we see that taken to its logical conclusion.


What the book of Hosea was hinting at we see writ large in the New Testament. God is the lover and spouse of his people. But we have given him the marriage from hell. God is in the longest-lived, worst marriage in the history of the world. We have turned to idols in our hearts, we have turned away from him, we have been absolutely terrible spouses. But God did not abandon us.

In Jesus Christ, God entered the world and paid the price to buy us away from our sin and enslavements by dying on the Cross. In essence, God says to us in the Bible: "In Jesus Christ I laid down my life for you. I did cosmically and visibly the thing that you have to do every time you try to love somebody who is flawed an imperfect. It was a substitutionary sacrifice. Your sin, your evil, your problems came onto me so that my righteousness could be put on you. Do you understand that? Now you understand how much I love you. Now you understand my delight in you." That message is the most life-changing, potent power in the world.

Old Testament Reading—1 Samuel 8:4-18

The Dangers of Earthly Kings

Then all the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah and said to him, "Behold, you are old and your sons do not walk in your ways. Now appoint for us a king to judge us like all the nations." But the thing displeased Samuel when they said, "Give us a king to judge us." And Samuel prayed to the Lord. And the Lord said to Samuel, "Obey the voice of the people in all that they say to you, for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them. According to all the deeds that they have done, from the day I brought them up out of Egypt even to this day, forsaking me and serving other gods, so they are also doing to you. Now then, obey their voice; only you shall solemnly warn them and show them the ways of the king who shall reign over them."

So Samuel told all the words of the Lord to the people who were asking for a king from him. He said, "These will be the ways of the king who will reign over you: he will take your sons and appoint them to his chariots and to be his horsemen and to run before his chariots. And he will appoint for himself commanders of thousands and commanders of fifties, and some to plow his ground and to reap his harvest, and to make his implements of war and the equipment of his chariots. He will take your daughters to be perfumers and cooks and bakers. He will take the best of your fields and vineyards and olive orchards and give them to his servants. He will take the tenth of your grain and of your vineyards and give it to his officers and to his servants. He will take your male servants and female servants and the best of your young men and your donkeys, and put them to his work. He will take the tenth of your flocks, and you shall be his slaves. And in that day you will cry out because of your king, whom you have chosen for yourselves, but the Lord will not answer you in that day.







Sermon


"The Good and Important Gift of Marriage" Sermon Series, Sermon on the Mount Matthew 5:31-32 Rev. Dr. Chris Polski
