# **Devotional Preparation**

In his commentary on Acts 1, RC Sproul wrote these words before passing into glory:

"I believe that within thirty years the largest and strongest branch of Christendom will be in Africa and that it is absolutely critical that the church in the United States right now pour as many resources as possible into the emerging churches of the Third World, particularly in Africa. We have the materials; we have things that these people need, to be grounded and strengthened for future generations. They cannot provide it, but we can. As we continue studying the book of Acts, we are going to see the first-century church in action, crawling over glass and pouring out blood— giving their lives—to obey Jesus' last command to be His witnesses to the uttermost parts of the earth."

Take a moment to consider that while we think often of Africa as the "ends of the earth," it is one of the first places that the Gospel spread. Christianity is indebted to African theologians, like Tertullian and Augustine. Had they known about the Americas, we would have been to them the "ends of the earth." Now, they need us, not to be saviors, but to come alongside them with resources to strengthen the work that is already happening.

Today, as we listen to our former missionary to Ethiopia and consider participating in our annual Mission's Project, remember our other missionaries on the continent of Africa: The Church's in Uganda, and the McGinty's in South Africa. Pray for them and their families. Pray for their labor and pray for the Holy Spirit to show you how you can join in His mission.

Salvation for Others





### Welcomers:

- Work in Samaria Oasis International has several volunteer openings available:
  - Nursery Workers: Help care for children on T/Th from 10:30 AM-12:15 PM. You
    don't have to commit every week or even both days—any help is appreciated!
  - <u>Diaper Delivery Teams:</u> Each month, we deliver 5,000 diapers to refugee moms in our area. This is a great opportunity to meet the same families regularly. Diapers can be picked up at Oasis and delivered to the homes within a 10-day window.
  - Furniture Delivery Teams: We need men, women, and even children for these teams! Each team should have at least 4 able-bodied people who can lift 50 lbs.
     (8-12 people is ideal). Deliveries typically happen on Saturdays from 9:30 AM to 1:00 PM.
  - Service Groups: Help with various tasks around the Oasis building, from cleaning to small repairs.
  - o <u>Individual Volunteers:</u> There are many positions available for individual volunteers, including organizing donations and answering phones.
