Devotional Preparation

Today we will explore the modern notion of identity which the psychologist Robert Bellah labels as "expressive individualism," or, the belief that "each person has a unique core of feeling and intuition that should unfold or be expressed if individuality is to be realized."

In his book Telling a Better Story, Chatraw shares an anecdote about how this gets worked out in our culture.

"An example of our culture's shift from looking outward to looking to ourselves is found in a recent Jeep Renegade commercial. The advertisement focuses on a group of young female music stars posed by the titular car, firing off the short axioms they live by: 'I have chosen to be...unapologetically me. A renegade is someone who doesn't seek the approval of other people. A renegade sets their own standard.' Meanwhile a line of text appears at the bottom of the screen, reading, 'Be unique. Be authentic.'

Upon the slightest reflection, one should wonder how purchasing a mass-marketed Jeep (and being persuaded by a commercial to do so) could ever constitute being unique or 'unapologetically me.' In this way, in one beautifully produced and self-contradicting minute, the commercial presents the defining moral ethos of our time." (Chatraw, 87)

Old Testament Reading—Job 42:10-17

The Lord Restores Job's Fortunes

Call to Confession—Mark 10:46-52

And they came to Jericho. And as he was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a great crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, the son of Timaeus, was sitting by the roadside. And when he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. • Ethiopia Missions Project through October 31st — The Polks and Grace of the Messiah Presbyterian Church in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia are seeking help in enabling this young denomination to purchase and complete a half-finished building for a local church plant worship space and denominational training center. Welcomers:

- Work in Samaria Oasis International has several volunteer openings available:
 - Nursery Workers: Help care for children on T/Th from 10:30 AM-12:15 PM. You
 don't have to commit every week or even both days—any help is appreciated!
 - Diaper Delivery Teams: Each month, we deliver 5,000 diapers to refugee moms in our area. This is a great opportunity to meet the same families regularly. Diapers can be picked up at Oasis and delivered to the homes within a 10-day window.
 - Furniture Delivery Teams: We need men, women, and even children for these teams! Each team should have at least 4 able-bodied people who can lift 50 lbs.
 (8-12 people is ideal). Deliveries typically happen on Saturdays from 9:30 AM to 1:00 PM.
 - Service Groups: Help with various tasks around the Oasis building, from cleaning to small repairs.
 - o <u>Individual Volunteers:</u> There are many positions available for individual volunteers, including organizing donations and answering phones.
