Devotional Preparation

The Crown of Life (Ligonier.org)

We are told that those who remain steadfast under trial will be blessed to receive the crown of life promised to those who love God (James 1:12). This wording closely matches Jesus' statement in Matthew 24:13 where we are told that only those who endure to the end will be saved. Only those who pass through trials with steadfastness will inherit eternal life. Only those who stand firm through these things will be saved.

This is not to say that in the final analysis salvation rests on our ability. The Bible clearly shows that we cannot save ourselves and that only the sovereign electing and preserving grace of God will bring us into His presence (Ps. 69:13–15; Rom. 8:29–30; Phil. 1:6). Nevertheless, the presence of God's electing grace in our lives is demonstrated by the fact that we cling to Him in our trials. We know that we have true faith only as we work out our salvation in fear and trembling, resting our hope of salvation on Christ alone (Phil. 2:12–13).

Those who face trials and in the end fall away demonstrate that they never had true faith from the beginning. On the other hand, those with true faith heed this teaching. They will be able to count it joy when their faith is tested because they know such tests will produce steadfastness (James 1:2–4). They will ask God for wisdom without doubting (vv. 5–8) so that they will be able to pass through the trials brought by poverty or by riches.



Old Testament Reading—Nehemiah 8:1-6

The Book of the Law is Read by Ezra


