Devotional Preparation

It seems strange, almost uncomfortable, that in Colossians 1:24, Paul says he rejoices in his sufferings. Most of us endure or cope with suffering, but we don't rejoice in it. Strangest of all, though, is that he says he is filling up what is lacking in Christ's afflictions. How can anything be lacking in Christ's afflictions? Jesus's death was "once for all."

I realized that here and elsewhere, Paul was re-enacting the gospel, Jesus's death for us. The word for means the weight of our sins comes on Jesus.

So just as Jesus substitutes himself for us, we substitute the pieces of our lives for others. Now I understood how Paul could fill up what is lacking in Christ's afflictions. Jesus's death was once for all. His death was finished... mine was ongoing. I could substitute myself for another. So, I have a mini death and the other lives. Paul articulates this:

For we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you. (2 Cor. 4:11-12)

Seeing this pattern of substitutionary love reoriented my view of what it meant to be a Christian. This meant the difference between a life of low-level irritation (like when your kids interrupt you while reading a book) and a life devoted to people (when you interrupt loving them to read a book). And when we understand that substitution is the heart of love, we see life through a different lens. We realize that all of life is love.

New Testament Reading—John 12:1-8

Mary Anoints Jesus at Bethany

Six days before the Passover, Jesus therefore came to Bethany, where Lazarus was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. So they gave a dinner for him there. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those reclining with him at table. Mary therefore took a pound of expensive ointment made from pure nard, and anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped his feet with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (he who was about to betray him), said, "Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" He said this, not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief, and having charge of the moneybag he used to help himself to what was put into it. Jesus said, "Leave her alone, so that she may keep it for the day of my burial. For the poor you always have with you, but you do not always have me."

Reader: The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of the Lord stands forever!

People: Thanks be to God!

Call to Confession—Philippians 3:4-8

If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless. But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord.

Silent Confession and Lament

Assurance of Pardon and Passing of the Peace—Phil. 3:8-9

For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith.

People: Thanks be to God!

Leader: Now may the peace of Christ be with you all!

SUNDAY SCHOOL
