Devotional Preparation

On Disappointment with God

Today we are going to explore another difficult challenge we face as believers in a fallen world, the idea of disappointment with God.

The notion of disappointment is always set in the context of expectations. If we don't have expectations, we usually aren't disappointed.

The big challenge when it comes to our Christian faith is that we worship a perfect, righteous and holy God who has told us that he is always working out things for the good for those who believe (Rom. 8:28). For many this is quickly translated into an *expectation* that God will always and only give us good things.

In his book, *Disappointment with God*, Phillip Yancey highlights this tendency that many believers have, saying:

"We tend to think, 'Life should be fair because God is fair.' But God is not life. And if I confuse God with the physical reality of life- by expecting constant good health for example- then I set myself up for crashing disappointment."

This "crashing disappointment" can cripple our faith and make us feel very distant from God.

What's wrong with this paradigm isn't so much the disappointment, but the nature of the expectation. When God says he is "working all things for the good" that doesn't mean that what he's doing in our life will be easy, happy or even understandable to us. The good he is working is good from his perspective, not ours. It's what he knows we need.

So, if you are struggling with disappointment with God, it's essential to go back and spend some time on the question of what kind of expectations you have of God and whether or not they are consistent with what he has told us in his word.
