WE READY OURSELVES TO WORSHIP

Reflect quietly and prayerfully on these words as we prepare to enter into worship.

J.I. Packer once wrote: "God's overriding goal is to glorify Himself."

Over time, I have heard some people point to statements like this as evidence that God is arrogant, unkind, and unworthy of human affection and therefore not to be worshipped.

On the surface, this sentiment seems understandable, after all, if any human being made it their goal to glorify themselves there isn't one of us that wouldn't accuse them of gross arrogance and dismiss them altogether.

However, the problems with applying this human standard to God are two-fold:

- 1. Human beings are definitely not the highest and most perfect being in the universe.
- 2. God is the highest and most perfect being in the universe.

Therefore, there is no being greater than God that is worthy of glory, so it follows that God must desire that He receive all the glory because to do otherwise would be to betray the truth, something that God cannot do.

In desiring that we glorify Him, God is simply teaching us to align ourselves with the proper parameters of all of His universal creation and in doing this He is giving us a gift in that we are learning not to kick out against the most fundamental truth of the universe, namely, that God is God and He alone is worthy of adoration.

But going one step further, its critical for us to see that God does not elevate this idea of glorifying Him for its own sake, but rather so that every human being that does rightly glorify Him will be able to enjoy the prospect of eternal life which is life as God always intended it to be. It is on the basis of this truth that Jesus prays in John 17 and that we worship today.



Call to Confession—Isaiah 58:1-5


