The Second Sunday of Lent- The Seed

During this Lenten season at Trinity we are growing a resurrection garden.

Last Sunday we initiated the garden by each contributing a handful of dirt. This was a symbol of what we contribute to our salvation...nothing! Just as our forerunners in faith would cover themselves in dust and ashes when they repented, so we to, in bringing those handfuls of dirt were recognizing that unless we are covered by the blood of Christ, we are lower than the dust and dirt of the ground before a Holy God.

As we come to this second Sunday of Lent, we turn our attention to the work that God does in redeeming us as symbolized in the sowing of a seed.

God is the first actor in our salvation and he does this by sowing the seed of salvation in our hearts. Paul reminds us of this in Ephesians 1:3-4:

³ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, ⁴ even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world...

There, mixed into the dirt of our sin, God begins the process of creating new life by implanting the seed of faith. And He continuously works to nurture that new life whether we see it or not. God is at work! He is doing something in the dirt! Way down beneath the surface the Master is starting something new and rich and beautiful that will be fully revealed in each of our hearts when the time is right.
