Welcome and Announcements

WE READY OURSELVES TO WORSHIP

Reflect quietly and prayerfully on these words as we prepare to enter into worship.

From John Frame's Systematic Theology (133):

"Are miracles probable? Of course they are unlikely, because they are by definition extraordinary. But that fact does not reduce their probability to zero. Probability like possibility, is determined by God. In a Christian-theistic worldview, our question becomes how likely it is that God will bring about miracles. To answer that question, we must know something about God, particularly about his intentions and goals. God announced to Noah that the course of nature would proceed in a way that is generally regular (Gen. 8:22). But God's higher intention is to redeem a people for himself, and to do that, it is appropriate for him to perform unusual works, to accomplish salvation, apply it, and attest it. If the world were governed by impersonal forces, there would be no reason to expect departures from the basic functions of those forces. But ours is a world ruled by a person, and he seeks fellowship with us. This is sufficient reason to expect that he will identify himself in the natural order, as the ruler of that order. And since he has ordained miracles as a mark of his lordship and an attestation of his revelation, we can say that miracles are significantly probable."



New Testament Reading—Matthew 14:13-21

Jesus miraculously feeds a great crowd

Now when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a desolate place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. When he went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them and healed their sick. Now when it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a desolate place, and the day is now over; send the crowds away to go into the villages and buy food for themselves."
