WE READY OURSELVES TO WORSHIP

Reflect quietly and prayerfully on these words as we prepare to enter into worship.

Our daughter Ella is a freshman at Covenant College, just outside of Chattanooga, and loving her time there in spite of all the restrictions due to Covid. She's made some great friends and had some great times. Like most people her age, she is an active Instagram-poster and back in the fall we noticed some picture on her Instagram feed of her and a few of her best girl-friends bundled up in blankets sitting on a rock overlooking a majestic mountain vista. So, we texted her and asked her where the picture was taken, and she said "North Carolina." We said, "We didn't know you were going to North Carolina" to which she responded, "Neither did we!"

New Testament Reading—1 Corinthians 1:18-25

For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written:

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise; the intelligence of the intelligent I will frustrate."

Where is the wise person? Where is the teacher of the law? Where is the philosopher of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not know him, God was pleased through the foolishness of what was preached to save those who believe. Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified: a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.


