WE READY OURSELVES FOR WORSHIP

Fight, Flight and Finding the Lord's Way- Rev. Dr. Chris Polski

In most cases, when things aren't going our way, we tend toward one of the following two common reactions.

Some people, when under pressure, position themselves to *fight* their way out and in doing so they determine that they must protect themselves even if it means others getting hurt. Others go to the opposite extreme and *flee* difficulty, thinking that if they can just separate themselves from the problem (physically, emotionally, etc) then it will eventually go away.

Interestingly we see both of these mindsets in play in the sordid and difficult story before us from Genesis 19:30-38 this morning. Lot has chosen *flight*, content to take up residence in a cave in order to escape his problems, and his daughters have chosen *fight*, taking matters into their own hands and along the way doing damage to themselves and others, even in a generational sense.

As I hope we will see this morning, these aren't the only two options available to us when we feel the weight of sin, disappointment and grief weighing down on us.

The third way is to *stay and pray. Stay* connected to the painful circumstance by laboring, in the Lord's strength to redeem it and *pray* that the Lord gives you the wisdom to overcome without doing damage to yourself and others. Our God is faithful! Over time he will give you the perspective you need in times like this to learn obedience, practice humility, and find contentment in His provisions, even if they aren't what you were expecting.

New Testament Reading—Mark 4:26-34

Jesus tells stories to help us understand the Kingdom of God

And he said, "The kingdom of God is as if a man should scatter seed on the ground. He sleeps and rises night and day, and the seed sprouts and grows; he knows not how. The earth produces by itself, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. But when the grain is ripe, at once he puts in the sickle, because the harvest has come."

And he said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable shall we use for it? It is like a grain of mustard seed, which, when sown on the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth, yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes larger than all the garden plants and puts out large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it. He did not speak to them without a parable, but privately to his own disciples he explained everything.

Reader: The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of the Lord stands forever!

People: Thanks be to God!
