Welcome and Announcements

WE READY OURSELVES FOR WORSHIP

Trinity Church began in the Fall of 2006 with a deep desire to be a church that was committed to the faithful exposition of God's word, a deep investment in pastoral care and a profound longing to impact its community with the gospel of grace. The original group of about 75 people began worshipping on Sunday evenings in October of 2006 and by the spring of 2007 called Pastor Polski to the post of founding pastor, beginning morning worship services in the summer of 2007. By the Fall of 2008 Trinity had particularized and seated its first elders and deacons.

At about this time Trinity sensed the Lord's leading to establish a set of strategic objectives to guide its ministry efforts which included a commitment to historical worship--freshly expressed, intergenerational ministry, worship in a single worship

service, not growing beyond 300 regular morning worshippers and planting churches to manage future growth within these parameters.

In late 2009 the Lord led Trinity to the Glenwood Lane property in Kirkwood and gave it the ability to purchase both the 7 acres and the abandoned Osage School located on the property for the bargain basement price of \$500,000. Shortly thereafter Trinity embarked on its first building campaign "Let us Love and Sing and Wonder" in which it raised \$1.2 million dollars to restore and renew the Osage School property to make it suitable for a church. At about the same time Trinity launched the Engage St. Louis outreach and tutoring ministry in partnership with South City Church, a partnership that lasted until just before the pandemic struck.

By 2016 Trinity had grown to the extent that it needed to make good on its core values at which time it decided to embark on a second campaign, "Capstone," to finalize the shape of the facility to accommodate the 300 weekly worshippers and set the church up for its next step of church planting. The congregation raised about \$800k toward this effort and the work was completed in early 2020 with the facility scheduled for dedication in March of that year. At about this same time Trinity was given the gift of 3 acres in south county which had explicitly been set aside for the purpose of future church planting.

In God's sovereign plan, the pandemic closed the facility for several weeks in the Spring of 2020 and because of the lingering struggles of the pandemic only recently enabled the facility to begin being used in its fullest sense.

Over the course of Trinity's fifteen-year history the Lord has blessed us with steady and consistent growth from a group of about 75 folks to a group of well over 300 members and regular attenders spread very evenly across generational lines and poised to take its next steps into the future. We are not a perfect church, but we are God's redeemed sons and daughters called to proclaim His excellencies to a watching world.

All along, Trinity's theme verse has come from 2 Corinthians 4:5, "For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants, for Jesus' sake."

May the Lord make the next season in our history as rich and vibrant as the first and may He use this week's season of Covenant Renewal toward that end!

God's Call and Promise for His Chosen People

So put away all malice and all deceit and hypocrisy and envy and all slander. Like newborn infants, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up into salvation— if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.

As you come to him, a living stone rejected by men but in the sight of God chosen and precious, you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in Scripture:




