

The Transfiguration

Now about eight days after these sayings he took with him Peter and John and James and went up on the mountain to pray. And as he was praying, the appearance of his face was altered, and his clothing became dazzling white. 

MISSION UPDATE

The situation in Ukraine has once again brought to the surface the situation that refugees face around the world. Like us, refugees want to live at peace. They want safety and security for themselves and their children. They want to experience the freedom and liberty that God intended for all humanity to have (even if they can't quite put words to that God-given desire). And they are willing to leave everything behind in order to find it.

As of the latest numbers, there are more than 83 million refugees around the world. This number is expected to increase drastically and rapidly due to the Russian invasion of Ukraine. The sad reality is that only about 1% of refugees make it out of the refugee camps to be resettled and start new lives in other countries. I was told a story about a young man, who at the age of 25 made it out of a camp and was resettled in St. Louis. He was born, raised, and married, in a camp. It was all he knew until he came here.

If they make it to a completely different country, there are ministries like Oasis, which come alongside them to help them acclimate to a new life in a strange new land. The Good Neighbor program, run by Oasis, seeks to create a new community of connection for them. Being a good neighbor shows refugees the love of Jesus and brings stability, healing, friendship, fun, and love into their lives. Trinity Church has been given the privilege and opportunity to serve in this program and we need you to step out and be the head, heart, and hands of Jesus for those who are currently "the least of these."
